Accounting charities





Does it all add up? Accounting charities help the sector!

Did you know that it can be charitable to support other charities? There are many charities listed on the charities register who support other charities to do their mahi (work). There are far too many to mention them all, but we thought we could tell you about a few who make accounting easier for charities.

In Auckland, the fabulous team at Auckland Community Accounting provide free accounting services for small community groups, including charitable trusts, incorporated societies and registered charities within the Auckland Region. Senior accountancy students are supervised by Chartered Accountants and can help you work out how to record and account for your income and expenditure. They can also recommend accounting software to report to your Board and other external organisations like the Companies Office and Charities Services. Visit their website to find out more. The programme is a partnership between Auckland North Community and Development (ANCAD), Massey University and Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CA ANZ). Another helpful charity is <u>Dunedin Community</u> <u>Accounting (DCA)</u>. Located in the centre of town in the Dunedin Community House, they offer a free, volunteer service for non-profits. Students and Chartered Accountants work together to help with accounting questions – big or small. DCA runs sessions each week.
