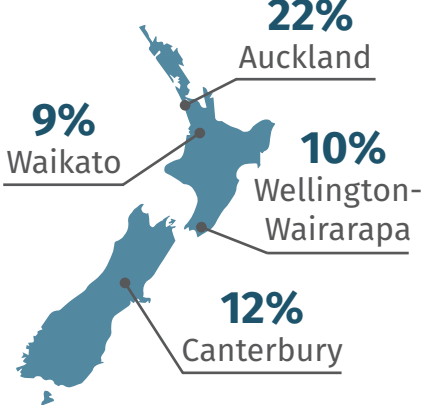

Biggest sectors:

- 22% Education/training and research
- 17% Religious activities
- 9% Arts, culture and heritage
